

What to Bring to College

- Television
- DVD/ Blue Ray Player
- Microwave (750 WATT or smaller)
- Refrigerator (4.0 or less cubic feet)
- Stereo
- Computer and printer (if available) ALSO an Ethernet cord
- Power strip/surge protector
- Playstation/Xbox
- Sports equipment (football, volleyball, basketball, and any other type of ball)
- Desk lamp
- Alarm clock
- Laundry bag (or basket) and laundry detergent
- Laundry money (quarters) We do provide them at the Security office 7-11pm
- Basic sewing kit (needles and thread or safety pins)
- Plates, bowls, cups and eating utensils
- Bedding and pillows
- Sheets (twin sized bed-75x38)
- Mattress pad
- Room decorations (photos/posters)
- Iron and small ironing board
- Organizer or planner (calendar)
- Backpack/ messenger bag
- Bike lock if you bring a bike. Must be kept outside
- Box fan or desk top fan
- Bath towels, soaps, robe, etc.
- Can opener
- First aid kit and band aids
- Personal hygiene items (toothpaste, deodorant, etc...)
- Shower shoes
- Umbrella
- Pictures of family and friends
- Your insurance card/health insurance information
- Phone cards (you can get your parents to buy these for you if you promise to call home)
- Lock box (for cash, medications, etc)
- White Sticky Putty (tape and tacks are prohibited on the walls)
- Batteries
- Flashlight
- Dry erase board and extra markers!

What NOT to Bring to College

- Pets (Fish are okay in a small bowl or tank)
- Firearms
- Weapons (even those that are “fake,” decorative, or used for a legitimate sporting purpose)
- Drugs (all medications should be kept in their original containers)
- Drug paraphernalia
- Alcohol
- Empty alcohol containers (even if they are for decoration... they are prohibited)
- Expensive or irreplaceable clothing and jewelry
- Off season clothes (your closets are only so big)
- Halogen lamp
- Candles, potpourri, and incense
- Toilet bowl deodorizers with wire or plastic hangers, such as “Bowl Fresh”
- Extension cords and multi-plug extenders/outlets
- Anything other than a 750-WATT microwave for cooking or heating food (this means no George Foreman grills, toasters, toaster ovens, crock pots, etc.)
- Space heaters
- Air conditioners
