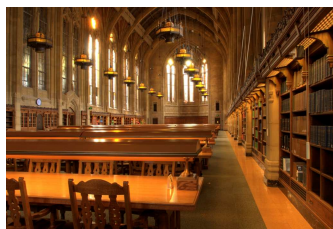
The Douglas Library is the stop that you will make this semester to see additions to the collections of print books, periodicals, DVDs, and CDs as well as many online resources.

## CIRCULATION DESK

### Borrowing from the Douglas Library

So how can you borrow those resources that Dr. Reagan mentioned above? Just bring your Clinton Community College ID card to the library. The Douglas Li-

brary does not issue a separate library card. We simply add a barcode to the back of your CCC ID card and enter that information in our online management system.

So stop by the circulation desk and ask for the barcode. You can also use your CCC ID

card (with library barcode on the back) to borrow books from Plattsburgh State's Feinberg Library.

Remember, we are open 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Friday.

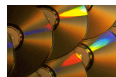
**Q. I have my own wireless laptop. Where are the campus hotspots?**

**A. The library, both lobbies in the main building, and the atrium area in the Stafford Building have wireless internet access. For more information on wireless access, go to the college's homepage ([www.clinton.edu](http://www.clinton.edu)), select "Network and Information Services" from the dropdown menu, then click on the "Wireless" link.**

**Q. How can I find information about computers and student e-mail on campus?**

**A. You can find answers to your technology questions on the Student Portal website ([www.clinton.edu/NIS/studentportal.xml](http://www.clinton.edu/NIS/studentportal.xml)) created by the Networking and Information Services staff. There is a link on the Clinton Community College homepage to this page. Just follow the instructions to enter the portal or click on the links on the left to find information on many topics including: usernames and passwords, e-mail accounts, wireless hotspots, student network space (50 MB), printing quotas, a knowledge base for MicroSoft Office and Outlook, password reset, etc.**

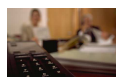
\***DNA: Secret of Photo 51**– Documentary on the discov-

## REFERENCE DESK

### MLA 2009 Updates

The seventh edition of the **MLA Handbook for Writers of Research Papers** includes the following changes:

- The *medium* of publication (DVD, Print, Web, etc.) is now included in every entry of a Works Cited list.
- the *Uniform Resource Locator*, also known as the URL or web address, is no longer included for Web publications.

• Both the *volume number* and the *issue number* are now included for all journal articles.

• *Titles* are now italicized instead of underlined.

### APA 2009 Updates

The sixth edition of the **Publication manual of the American Psychological Association** also has some changes:

- Digital Object Identifier (DOI): provide the DOI

if one has been assigned to the content and use this format for the DOI in the reference list:

doi:10.xxxx/xxxxxxxxxxx

• If there is no DOI, include the homepage URL of the journal, newspaper, magazine, etc.

We've updated the MLA and APA guides on our website and librarians are available to provide assistance.
