





Find Books & Videos in the Library Catalog

- [Douglas Library Catalog](#) – Search for materials at CCC’s Douglas Library.
 - **New feature:** On the Library Catalog search screen, click **My Library Account** to sign into your library account. You can renew books and media online one time if they’re not overdue, and place holds on books checked out to another patron.

Online Books (E-Books)


Douglas Library has hundreds of free e-books available for student use. Just click [Online Books](#) to access our e-book collection.
